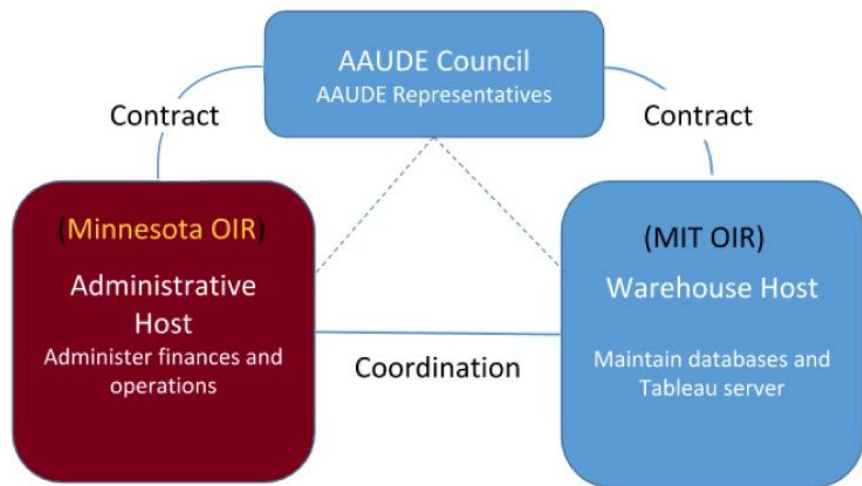




ABOUT AAUDE

Organized in 1974 by institutional research officers from AAU universities with the support of their presidents, **Association of American Universities Data Exchange (AAUDE)** is a data-sharing consortium of 64 distinguished research universities. AAUDE makes private and public benchmarking information accessible to inform administrative decision-making within member institutions and in the broader policy discussions relevant to research universities. AAUDE is a voluntary service organization, completely independent from the AAU.



ADMINISTERING THE ASSOCIATION OF AMERICAN UNIVERSITIES DATA EXCHANGE (AAUDE)

The Office of Institutional Research (OIR) is starting the third year of a five-year agreement to oversee the data exchange operations. OIR manages the leadership council, policy implementation, membership, finances, volunteers, and the AAUDE annual meeting of university representatives. This annual meeting occurs each spring and is hosted at member institutions around North America.

To maintain high quality services, the UMN staff work closely with the data warehouse operations at MIT.

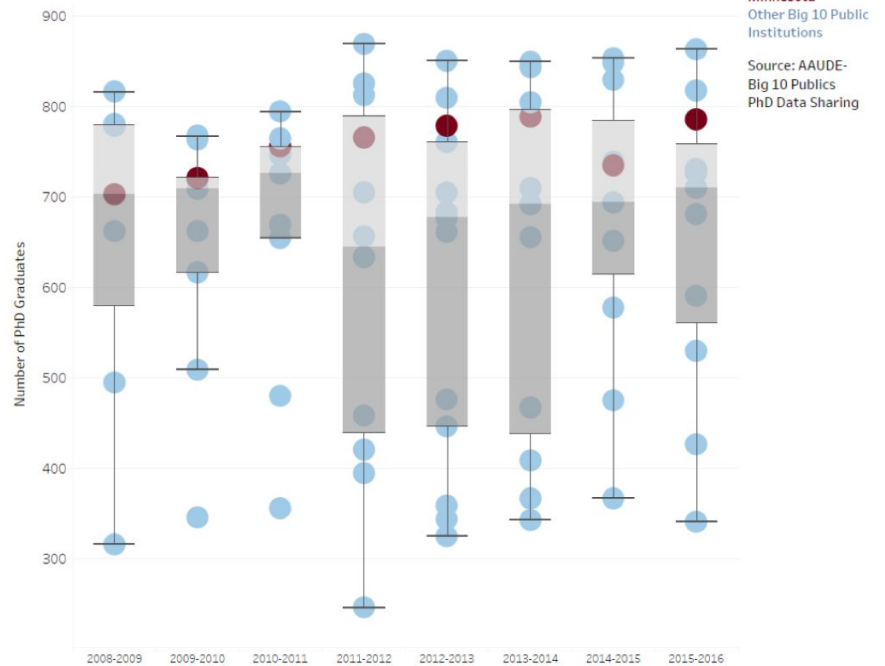

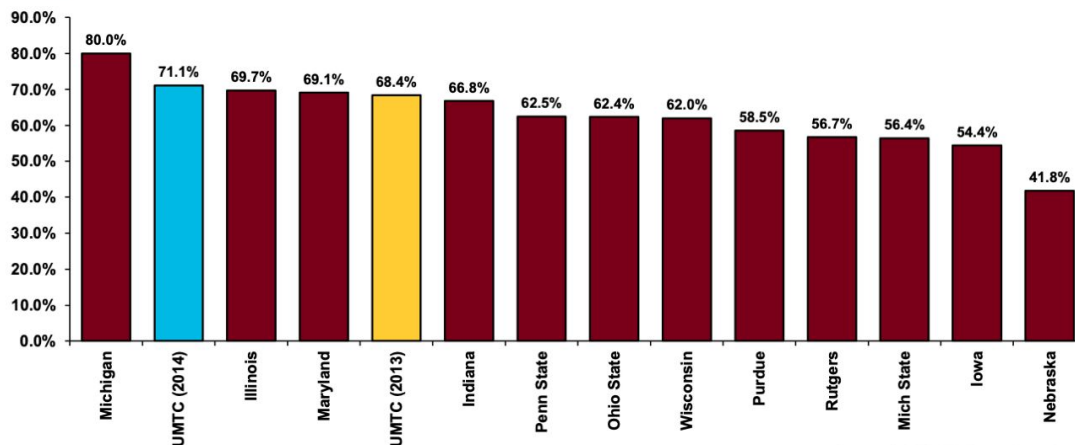
